Reflections with Pastor Scott

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me."



Matthew 25:35-36

These are familiar words from Jesus on how we each bear the image of God and what we do or do not do to others we do or do not do to Christ. While these words are well known, how often do you hear of churches actually connecting with those in prison? We at CLC went to Monroe a few times to be a support to prisoners having completed a retreat weekend. Then the program was shut down and it was disappointing to the prisoners and to many in our group.

Here is a chance for us to take another step in bearing the love of Christ with those in prison and those looking to take up life again outside of prison after paying their debt for their crimes. Pastor Chris Hoke is part of *Underground Ministries* and *One Parish, One Prisoner* and will be offering the message on June 13 as we join with Faith Lutheran, Our Savior's Lutheran, and Freeborn Lutheran churches for worship. You can gather in person at our regular 10am worship time or click the streamyard link that will be posted on the website and sent via the all church email. The online service starts at 10am that day. Pastor Chris was very adamant that the message take place withing the context of worship as that is the core that leads to our discipleship being lived out.

I am including a link that you can watch a head of time to learn a bit more about this ministry. https://undergroundministries.org/opop Great care is taken in the vetting process, so not just anyone is chosen for the program. A group of people is trained and meets with the person once a month for two years. The first year is while they are still in prison. You will get to know the person and they you. The second year when they are out of prison you will continue to meet once a month as this is a crucial time for them to find work and places to live and have support once out of prison. You are not the one providing these things, but hopefully between the whole group there will be resources people are aware of to get the person connected for jobs, living arrangements, etc...We hope to create a group or several groups from our cluster congregations.

Pastor Chris spoke at our Spring Bishop's Conference and we were truly inspired by this incredible ministry and the opportunity for us to be a part of this ministry.

The Bishop's Article from the June 2021 edition of The Spirit



I began my Bishop's Report for the 2021 Synod Assembly on May 15, 2021 by quoting Paul in his letter to the Romans, "I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world."

I am so glad to be the Northwest Washington Synod with you – as we walk, journey, travel together. We are connected as the body of Christ – as siblings in Christ – together. We are the Northwest Washington Synod in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Together in Jesus Christ we are freed by grace to live faithfully, witness boldly, and serve joyfully. As people forgiven and redeemed, beloved and

welcomed, we are called to embody God's grace in speech, action, and relationships. I am reminded daily that it is Jesus Christ who loves, welcomes, and forgives. As baptized children of God, we are called to participate in this love, hospitality, and forgiveness. I am thankful for all of you for your love, your welcome, and your forgiveness.

We on the synod staff have agreed to embrace the following statement as we work together with the congregations and ministry sites of this synod: "Trusting in the Spirit, we are journeying together with God's people so that all may discover and participate in what God is doing among us through Jesus."

Further, there are five focus areas interwoven in the work that we are doing as we journey together in Christ:

- 1. Faithful Innovation
- 2. Youth and Young Adults
- 3. Leadership
- 4. Connection
- 5. Racial Justice

I'd like to lift up a few of the actions from the 2021 NW WA Synod Assembly:

- We had our first online assembly with 332 voting members in attendance on Zoom and over 200 following along on our Facebook Livestream.
- We approved the Recommended Changes to the Constitution that were forwarded from the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.
- We approved the changes to the Constitution proposed by the Synod Council (with a minor amendment to have the Nominating Committee changed to 5 persons).
- We elected persons to the following:

Synod Council

Committee on Discipline

Consultation Committee

- Voting Members to the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly
- Approved budget.
- We shared videos from our ministry partners and synod committees/teams.
- Announced Grace Grants recipients.

As we do the work of this synod, I am reminded that it is not us but the Spirit that leads and guides. Trusting God's promises and participating in the Holy Spirit, we have reached places beyond what I thought possible. We have exceeded priorities and we are moving forward towards God's preferred future. I am grateful to be on this journey with you.

Do You Know How to Recognize a Stroke?

STROKE IDENTIFICATION:

During a BBQ, a woman stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call paramedics) ...she said she had just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes. They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food. While she appeared a bit shaken up, Jane went about enjoying herself the rest of the evening.

Jane's husband called later telling everyone that his wife had been taken to the hospital - (at 6:00 PM Jane passed away.) She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps Jane would be with us today. Some don't die. They end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead.

It only takes a minute to read this.

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Thank God for the sense to remember the '3' steps, STR. Read and Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

- S * Ask the individual to SMILE.
- T * Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently)
 (i.e. Chicken Soup)
- R * Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

New Sign of a Stroke ----- Stick out Your Tongue!

NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out his/her tongue. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other that is also an indication of a stroke.

A cardiologist says if everyone who gets this email sends it to 10 people; you can bet that at least one life will be sayed.


